

A few months ago, I was invited to join in with eight ROTC programs "Ranger Challenge" competition in the mountains near Fort Collins. You may remember us writing about it. It was through this opportunity that I was able to meet the commander of the Wyoming ROTC program. I offered in passing that I would be available if they ever needed anything. It was late one night in early February when he took me up on that offer. I was informed that there had been a death with one of their cadets and he asked if I could come up and offer religious support. I went early the next morning to be available to the cadets. Many of them were in shock and shared their confusion over the tragic nature of their peer's death. I listened and prayed for them. Quite a few of them recognized me from the Ranger Challenge event. (Actually, the picture above is some of these Wyoming cadets.) It was because they were familiar with me, saw me in uniform, and trusted me through prior experiences they felt comfortable to come talk about their loss.

Being in ministry for the past 22 years has taught me that we must accept the fact that we may not get to see outwardly the results of how God is working. I am reminded of Hebrews 11 where we are reminded of the "hall of faith," where we see a picture of Abraham, Sarah, Noah, Isaac and Jacob, who all died before seeing the fulfillment of God's promise, but in faith received a glimpse of God's future fulfillment. I feel like this experience in Wyoming was a glimpse of God's bigger vision as I was able to see clearly how He is using these two callings of Valor and chaplaincy for His kingdom. *Please keep the Wyoming battalion in your prayers as they grieve this loss. Pray that I can follow up and be a continued resource for them.*

On another note, I've been encouraged by how God is working in the lives of our Valor leaders at the University of Washington. I just meet with Micah, who is our 4th generation of Valor leader. He feels called to serve in the Air Force as a chaplain. *Pray for him to finish school and AF ROTC well*.
