Fire, Water & the Presence of God

(2 Kings 2:1-14)

Group Interaction & Application

Read aloud together 2 Kings 2:1-14.

What words, phrases, concepts, or images from these verses stand out to you as you just read them, or create a curiosity for you in some way?

What aspects of Pastor KJ's message gave you fresh insight into this passage, or helped you the most in understanding these verses and what we experience here?

In what ways, if any, did the symbolism (fire, water, meanings or names, etc.) packed in this portion of Scripture speak to you or help bring deeper meaning to what God is revealing to us?

What are some significant life transitions you have gone through, are in right now, or are soon to face?

If in the past, how did you handle these transitions?

If in the present, how are you handling this transition?

If in the near future, how are you dealing with the anticipation of this transition?

When have you, like Elijah, come to a season where it was time for you to hand the torch to someone else?

What was this like to hand over this responsibility?

When have you, like Elisha, been handed the torch to carry on a mission?

What was this like to take on this new responsibility?

As Elisha took on this new role (vs. 13), God's presence was on display.

As you navigate transitions in life, how proactively are you inviting God into these seasons?

If/when you call on God's presence, how fully are you experiencing it?

Where are you needing God to show up for you in your present season of life? (vs. 14)

If you feel a void of God's presence, how are you navigating this reality?

Elisha not only acknowledged his need of God; he asked, "for a double portion of your spirit." (vs. 9).

How much of God's Spirit are you asking for and how much are you expecting?

And what is driving your level of ask/expectation?

Conclude by praying for one another in taking practical next steps in applying this weekend's message and group discussion, after which pray for group needs and concerns.
