What Now?

(Acts 1:12-26)

## **Group Interaction & Application**

Read aloud together Acts 1:12-26.

What words, phrases, concepts, or images from these verses stand out to you as you just read them, or create a curiosity for you in some way?

What aspects of Pastor Mariana's message gave you fresh insight into this passage, or helped you the most in understanding these verses and what we experience here?

How well do you handle periods of life filled with the unknown?

If you have practices that help you thrive during these seasons, share what they are.

When have you been excited by a vision but uncertain how to make the vision come to fruition?

What was it like to live in that tension?

Within this portion of scripture, we see examples of how the disciples navigated a season of waiting.

They took a next step (returning to Jerusalem). (vs. 12)

If you find yourself in a season of waiting/uncertainty, what is a next step you could take?

Or if you have found yourself in a season like this in the past, was there a next step, no matter how small, that helped you move forward while continuing to wait patiently?

### They united in prayer (joining together constantly in prayer). (vs. 14)

In what ways have you utilized communal prayer to handle a season of uncertainty/waiting?

How did this go?

How much of a regular spiritual practice is communal prayer for you in your walk?

#### They found strength in community (a group numbering about 120). (vs. 15)

Who are the community members who are helping you navigate the uncertainties/challenges of life?

Who might be available for you to join with that you are not currently accessing?

#### They addressed needs while they waited (new leader for Judas' position). (vs. 15)

If you find yourself in a current season of waiting, what needs might you address while you wait?

#### They submitted to God ("show us which of these two"). (vs. 24)

What has it looked life for you to submit to God in a period of waiting?

If you are needing to submit to God today, what could this look like?

Conclude by praying for one another in taking practical next steps in applying this weekend's message and group discussion, after which pray for group needs and concerns.
