Catalytic Moment

(Acts 2:22-37)

Group Interaction & Application

Read aloud together Acts 2:22-37.

What words, phrases, concepts, or images from these verses stand out to you as you just read them, or create a curiosity for you in some way?

What aspects of Pastor Stetson's message gave you fresh insight into this passage, or helped you the most in understanding these verses and what we experience here?

Within these verses, Peter is revealing who Jesus is. He declares that Jesus is, "accredited by God" (vs. 22), that he was, "handed over (to man) by God's deliberate plan" (vs. 23), put to death, and then, "raised from the dead." (vs. 24), and that his life was the fulfillment of prophecy. (vs. 25-32).

Peter also declares Jesus to be, "both Lord and Messiah (deliverer/rescuer)." (vs. 36)

How do you respond to the picture Peter paints of Jesus (miracle worker, obedient to the point of death, resurrected, fulfillment of prophecy, Lord)?

When did you personally fully embrace who Jesus is?

If you are continuing to discover who Jesus is, what is currently being revealed to you?

What difference has it made in your life to embrace who Jesus is?

How aware are you in your daily walk of your need to be rescued by Jesus?

Why might it be so important to recognize this need?

What are your expectations of what Jesus can do for you?

What are you longing for from Jesus today?

If Jesus came as the Messiah to set us free (John 8:32, 36), how fully are you living in this freedom?

If you are not experiencing the freedom you long for, what might you be missing as you gaze upon and interact with Jesus?

Even if the moment you put your trust in Jesus as your Messiah (rescuer) was many years ago, what can that moment (no matter how many years ago it took place) mean for you today?

Conclude by praying for one another in taking practical next steps in applying this weekend's message and group discussion, after which pray for group needs and concerns.
