### Inflection Point

(Acts 10:23-11:18)

### Group Interaction & Application

Read aloud Acts 10:23-11:18.

What words, phrases, concepts, or images from these verses stand out to you as you just read them, or create curiosity for you in some way?

What aspects of Pastor Howard's message gave you fresh insight into this passage, or helped you the most in understanding these verses and what we experience here?

Pastor Howard described an "inflection point" as, "a pinpoint in time after which things are dramatically different."

When have you experienced an inflection point in your own personal church journey or your own faith walk?

What caused this inflection point and what happened because of this experience?

Within these verses (and those that preceded), we encounter a powerful inflection point for Peter and the early church.

Jesus challenges Peter to break free from seeing those around him as, "us vs. them." (vs. 34-35)

When, if ever, have you wrestled with an “us vs. them” (who belongs and who does not) mentality especially within the context of the church?

If there is a person or a people group who you recognize you are currently treating as a “them,” share a bit about why this is so.

What could it look like to take steps to treat this person or people group as an “us”?

Jesus being for all people is emphasized through the work of the Holy Spirit (vs. 44-46).

Where have you seen the Holy Spirit show up in unexpected places?

In what ways, if any, does the Holy Spirit’s activity in Cornelius’ life (as a yet to be follower of Jesus) surprise, confuse, or encourage you? (vs. 30-33, 44)

Peter’s world view is being dramatically changed within these verses.

When have you potentially been wrong about God’s plan or God’s heart?

If you struggle to fully embrace God’s heart for all people (vs. John 12:32, John 3:16), how might you begin to address this?

Throughout your life, where has Jesus’ love empowered you to see those around you differently?

Conclude by praying for one another in taking practical next steps in applying this weekend’s message and group discussion, after which pray for group needs and concerns.
