Our Cornerstone

(I Peter 2:4-8)

Group Interaction & Application

Read aloud I Peter 2:4-8.

What words, phrases, concepts, or images from these verses stand out to you as you just read them, or create curiosity for you in some way?

What aspects of Pastor Nate's message gave you fresh insight into this passage, or helped you the most in understanding these verses and what we experience here?

Throughout your life, when has your foundation been rocked?

Within this text, Pastor Nate sees Peter address three concepts that can help us build a foundation that holds.

First, you **build on** what you run to. (vs. I Peter 2:4)

Other than Jesus, what do you tend to run to when you feel burdened or stressed?

How well does it work when you run to these things?

Where have these things potentially failed you?

Conversely, when has building your foundation on Jesus delivered you through a challenging time?

Second, you **are built** by who you run to. (1 Peter 2:5)

How natural is it for you to run to Jesus when your life encounters hardship or trauma?

What does it look like for you to run to Jesus vs. other things?

In what ways, if any, does Jesus serve as your cornerstone?

What does it look like for you to position Jesus as your cornerstone?

What encouragement, if any, do you draw from the fact that Peter tells us Jesus is the builder of our lives, not us?

What does it or could it look like to embrace this reality more fully?

Third, the living stone holds. (1 Peter 2:7-8)

What cornerstones in your life (outside of Jesus) do you see yourself at times forcing Jesus to fit around?

When have you potentially refused to surrender something to the cornerstone that is Jesus?

If there is something you are currently wrestling with that feels in opposition to the cornerstone of Jesus, share a bit about this wrestling.

What might it look like for you to yield more fully to the direction you feel Jesus is calling you to?

When has holding to the cornerstone of Jesus, even when your urges wanted to take you another direction, protected or blessed you?

Pastor Nate shared a simple 5-word prayer he likes to pray, “Jesus, I’m coming to you.”

If you have a similar prayer that helps ground you, share it with the group.

Or if you have tried implementing Pastor Nate’s prayer, how has that gone?

Conclude by praying for one another in taking practical next steps in applying this weekend’s message and group discussion, after which pray for group needs and concerns.
