Our Identity Together

(I Peter 2:9-10)

Group Interaction & Application

Read aloud I Peter 2:9-10

What words, phrases, concepts, or images from these verses stand out to you as you just read them, or create curiosity for you in some way? Why?

What aspects of Pastor Alan's message gave you fresh insight into this passage, or helped you the most in understanding these verses and what we experience here?

Opening Questions

Think about a time when you felt like you really belonged to a group or community. What made you feel that way?

Peter describes believers with four powerful identity statements. Why do you think he emphasizes *identity together*, not just as individuals?

First Identity Statement: In a fragmented world, you are chosen people.

Our culture often divides people by labels (race, politics, status, etc.). Where do you see this most clearly today?

How can Christians celebrate ethnic and cultural diversity while still recognizing that our ultimate unity is in Jesus?

According to Pastor Alan, being chosen is not about exclusion but *mission*. What might it look like for our church to live that out?

Second Identity Statement: In a spectator world, you are a royal priesthood.

Our culture loves spectatorship (sports, concerts, entertainment). How can that mindset influence the way people approach church? In which ways do you catch yourself adopting that posture in your faith journey?

In our new identity in Christ, we are not “sitting on the bench”; we’re on the field. In what ways can someone move from being a spectator to being an active participant?

Read Exodus 19:5-6. What does it practically mean that every believer is part of a royal priesthood?

When you gather with other believers what gifts might you bring to others?

Third Identity Statement: In a morally unanchored world, you are a holy nation.

Pastor Alan explains that holiness is about identity before behavior. Why is that distinction important?

How does understanding who you are (or who you belong to) drive what you do? If you have noticed practical examples of that in your life, please share with the group.

We can easily forget how miserable life is when we’re ignoring God and giving into sin. What is one area where God might be inviting you to step out of darkness and into His light?

Fourth Identity Statement: In a world where many feel unseen, you are God’s treasured possession

Many people today struggle with feeling invisible or unimportant. Why do you think that is so common?

How does the truth that believers are God’s treasured possession change the way we view ourselves? And how should this truth shape the way we treat others?

Which of the four identity statements speaks most deeply to you right now? Why?

What is one practical way you can live out this identity in the coming week?

Conclude by praying for one another in taking practical next steps in applying this weekend’s message and group discussion, after which pray for group needs and concerns.
