Living a Life of Blessing

(I Peter 3:8-17)

Group Interaction & Application

Read aloud together I Peter 3:8-17.

What words, phrases, concepts, or images from these verses stand out to you as you just read them, or create curiosity for you in some way?

What aspects of Pastor Nate's message gave you fresh insight into this passage, or helped you the most in understanding these verses and what we experience here?

How empty or full do you feel – today and on a regular basis?

Why is either the case?

What is your current capacity to give of yourself to those around you?

Within this passage, Pastor Nate sees Peter describe how blessing starts in us, how it flows through us, and how it speaks for us.

First, blessing starts in us. (I Peter 3:8)

In what ways have you been blessed?

When do you most naturally react to the world around you as you were designed to respond (w/ sympathy, love, compassion, patience)?

What enables you to live more fully in this state?

What hinders you from living more fully in this state?

Second, blessing flows through us. (I Peter 3:9-12)

Pastor Nate suggests that fear is a significant obstacle to blessing flowing out of us.

What fears have the potential to hinder a flow of blessing out of you?

How do you respond to the world around you when fear surfaces?

How “seen” by God do you feel?

What impact does this have on your ability to share blessing?

When fear rises in you, what steps can or do you take to address this reality?

Third, blessing speaks for us. (I Peter 3:15)

When have you been able to bless others while you were experiencing a challenging moment or season?

How did this make you feel to be able to do this and what perceived impact did this have on the people around you?

When has someone blessed you during their own personal hardship and what impact did this make on you?

Would you agree or disagree that a blessed life is less about circumstances and more about foundation? Elaborate on why either is the case.

How do you root yourself in a foundation that supersedes the circumstances of life?

Conclude by praying for one another in taking practical next steps in applying this weekend’s message and group discussion, after which pray for group needs and concerns.
