Sparkling with our Freedom in Christ

(Galatians 5:13)

Group Interaction & Application

Read aloud together Galatians 5:13.

What words, phrases, concepts, or images from these verses stand out to you as you just read them, or create curiosity for you in some way?

What aspects of Pastor Howard's message gave you fresh insight into this passage, or helped you the most in understanding these verses and what we experience here?

In his sermon, Pastor Howard points out four freedoms we can experience as followers of Christ.

First, we are Free from the penalty of sin. (John 3:16)

Read together Romans 3:23, 6:23, and John 3:16.

What thoughts come to mind as you reflect on these verses?

How often, if ever, do you celebrate your freedom from the penalty of sin?

What does it look like for you to celebrate this freedom?

Second, we are Free from the ongoing power of sin. (Galatians 5:16)

How has being a follower of Christ helped you break certain cycles of sin?

If there is a sin(s) that is a perpetual challenge for you today, what steps could you take to experience freedom from this reality?

Third, we are Free to love others. (Galatians 5:13-14)

How has being a follower of Christ enabled you to love others well?

When has following Christ empowered you to love individuals or groups of people who you struggled to love before?

What allowed this change?

Fourth, we are Free to serve. (Galatians 5:13)

Read together Matthew 20:26-28.

How well do you “see” those around you?

In what ways are you currently serving those around you?

In what ways might you serve those around you more fully – more intentionally?

Conclude by praying for one another in taking practical next steps in applying this weekend’s message and group discussion, after which pray for group needs and concerns.
