God's Heart for the Foreigner

(Deuteronomy 10:12-22)

Group Interaction & Application

Read aloud together Deuteronomy 10:12-22.

What words, phrases, concepts, or images from these verses stand out to you as you just read them, or create curiosity for you in some way?

What aspects of Pastor Alan's message gave you fresh insight into this passage, or helped you the most in understanding these verses and what we experience here?

How does it impact your heart to hear God share His love for the foreigner? (vs. 10:18)

If you, yourself, are an immigrant to the United States, what does hearing the words in this passage spark inside you?

How easy or challenging is it for you to, "love the foreigners residing among you"?

Whether hard or easy, why might either be the case?

If your ability to love the foreigner well has evolved throughout your life, share a bit about this journey and what has initiated this evolution.

Pastor Alan highlights from this passage three ways we can love the foreigner.

First, Love listens to another's story. (vs. 10:19)

If you immigrated to the U.S., what does it mean to you when others are curious to hear your story?

When have you learned something new or had your perspective changed by hearing the story of a foreigner/immigrant living among you?

If you work, play or interact with immigrants/refugees in northern CO, have you ever asked them about their story? If yes, how did this go?

If there is an immigrant in your current life circle, what could it look like to get to know them better?

Second, Love lifts up another person.

What type of language do you use when speaking about the foreigners around you?

If you have ever categorized a whole group of immigrants off an isolated pocket within this group, where does this come from?

How fair or accurate is this?

If labels have ever given you permission to not love a group of people, share a bit about this experience.

Third, Love looks out for another person (vs. 10:18)

How have you helped a foreigner/immigrant in the past?

If you have been a foreigner in another country, when did someone help you and what impact did this make on you?

What first step could you take to love a foreigner living among you today?

Pastor Alan mentioned several potential first steps. Did any of these spark a particular interest for you?

If you are seeing the reality of immigration any different today than before hearing this sermon, share how so.

Conclude by praying for one another in taking practical next steps in applying this weekend's message and group discussion, after which pray for group needs and concerns.

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
